History of HPP

Original land owned by Shipman, used for cattle grazing.

1959-Subdivision map for Hawaiian Paradise Park submitted by David Watumull and B.K. Murphy.

- Average price per lot \$800
- Ads in California sold 2,000 lots sight unseen

1960s-Roads were only red cinder.

1972-Paradise Park Hui Hanalike formed as a non-profit corporation by residents.

1977-Legal out of court settlement with Watumull. Paradise and Maku'u to be paved.

Roads in increments 2 and 7-20 acre parcels deeded to association. Once parcel for office, activity center, and maintenance; 6 parcels deed restricted for park and school use. Road crew and community association separate entities.

1984-Hawaii Supreme Court decision to mandate road maintenance fees for all lots abutting HPP roads. County exempted from any obligation in perpetuity.

1995 - Fire station built.

2001 - Road group and community group merged. Name changed to Hawaiian Paradise Park Owners Association. Bylaws approved by court.


2010 - Last approved revision of HPPOA Bylaws.


