PETITION FOR CHARTER OF INCORPORATION

TO THE HONORABLE DIRECTOR OF REGULATORY AGENCIES, STATE OF HAWAII:

Your petitioners, ERNEST A. REEDER, ALBERT O'NEIL, FRANK WELLINGTON and PAMELA TINGCANG, all residents of the State of Hawaii, being desirous of forming a non-profit corporation for themselves, their associates and their successors, pursuant to the provisions of Section 416-19, Hawaii Revised Statutes, pray that a Charter of Incorporation be granted to them, whereby they, their associates and their successors may be made a body corporate of the State of Hawaii under the name of PARADISE HUI HANALIKE, for benevolent and charitable purposes, with all of the rights, powers, privileges and immunities granted by law to corporations of this character and with all the duties, obligations and restrictions imposed by law upon such corporations, and in support of this petition, hereby respectfully submit a proposed form of Charter of Incorporation, all of the terms whereof are by reference thereto hereby incorporated in and made a part of this petition.

I

NAME

The name of the corporation shall be PARADISE  
HUI HANALIKE.

II

LOCATION

The location of the corporation shall be in  
Hawaiian Paradise Park, Puna, County and State of Hawaii,  
and its initial post office address shall be Keaau,  
Hawaii, 96749.

III

OBJECTS AND PURPOSES

The objects and purposes for which the corporation  
is organized are as follows:

- (a) To improve and beautify our community.
- (b) To actively represent our community before any  
agencies on matters affecting our community.
- (c) To participate in general Big Island activities.
- (d) To promote youth activities.
- (e) To promote social and recreational activities  
in our community.
- (f) To aid fellow members and area residents in  
times of distress.

IV

DURATION

The corporation shall have perpetual succession and existence.

V

OFFICERS

1. The principal officers of the corporation shall be a President, one or more Vice-Presidents, a Secretary and a Treasurer. There may be such other officers as may be provided in the Bylaws of the corporation.

2. There shall be a Board of Directors composed of the principal officers and such other members of the corporation as provided in the Bylaws of the corporation.

3. The principal officers, other officers and directors shall be elected or appointed in the manner provided in the Bylaws of the corporation, and shall have such powers and duties prescribed in the Bylaws.

4. The initial officers and directors of the corporation who shall serve until their successors are duly elected or appointed shall be as follows:

## VI

### BYLAWS

The Bylaws of the corporation shall be adopted, amended or repealed in a manner not inconsistent with law. A certified copy of the Bylaws and all amendments shall be filed with the Director of Regulatory Agencies, State of Hawaii, not less than thirty (30) days after adoption.

## VII

### POWERS AND OBLIGATIONS

The corporation shall be subject to all the duties, obligations and restrictions imposed by law upon corporations of this character, and it shall have all the rights, powers, privileges and immunities granted by law to such corporations and as follows:

1. To have perpetual succession by its corporate name;

2. To sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded in any and all courts;

3. To make and use a corporate seal and alter the same at its pleasure;

4. To hold, purchase and convey such property as the purposes of the corporation may require, without limit as to amount, and to mortgage, pledge and hypothecate the same to secure any debt of the corporation;

5. To appoint such subordinate officers and agents as the business of the corporation requires;

6. To obtain capital and revenue for the fulfillment of its purposes and objects through the sponsorship of public or private entertainment, donations, subscriptions, assessments, dues or otherwise.

7. To make Bylaws not inconsistent with any existing law or this Charter of Incorporation for the management of its property, the admission and expulsion of members, the election and removal of its officers and directors, the regulation of its affairs and the transfer of its property.

8. To perform any and all acts necessary, suitable or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes or for the attainment of any of the objects or for the exercise of any of the powers herein set forth.

#### VIII

#### NON-PROFIT

The corporation is not organized for profit and it will not issue any stock, and no part of its assets, income or

earnings shall be distributed to its members, directors or officers, except for services actually rendered to the corporation, and except upon liquidation of its property in case of corporate dissolution, in which event, all property owned by the corporation shall be distributed to another society, association or corporation engaged in religious, charitable, educational, scientific, literary or other benevolent purposes.

CHARTER OF INCORPORATION

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

WHEREAS, ERNEST A. REEDER, ALBERT O'NEIL, FRANK WELLINGTON and PAMELA TINGCANG, all residents of the State of Hawaii, have filed in the Office of the Director of Regulatory Agencies, State of Hawaii, a verified petition praying that a Charter of Incorporation be granted to them whereby they, their associates and their successors may be made a body corporate under the name of PARADISE HUI HANALIKE, for benevolent and charitable purposes, with all of the rights, powers, privileges and immunities granted by law to corporations of this character.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, EDWIN H. HONDA, Director of Regulatory Agencies, State of Hawaii, under and by virtue of the authority granted me by law, do hereby constitute and appoint ERNEST A. REEDER, ALBERT O'NEIL, FRANK WELLINGTON and PAMELA TINGCANG, their associates and successors, as a body corporate with perpetual succession and existence, under the name of PARADISE HUI HANALIKE, and do hereby grant unto them this Charter of Incorporation, as follows:
