This past month was busy with the election, paving jobs and mailboxes.

The election took place and all ballots counted on Saturday, June 3rd by the League of Women voters. While there were a couple issues with a duplicate ballot or two, the election was certified as fair, and results were posted on the website. I would like to thank Jon again for his hours of working to get the ballots printed which was very challenging.

We completed the final paving of 4th and Pohaku Drive so all that is left is striping Pohaku Drive. Thanks to Jason and Larry for keeping a watchful eye on these paving jobs to ensure they are done to specs.

We continued to work on the mailbox project, got out the RFPs for the Civil Engineer and grading contractors. Bids were due yesterday, and we will open them tonight in the Executive Session. We are having biweekly meetings now with the USPS till the project is complete. We posted information on the website including 35 Q&As about the mailboxes. We will continue to update the information as it is available.

Larry has been gathering a lot of data on the roads to put together a comprehensive maintenance plan to ensure that all gravel roads are worked on once every two months. He has also completed getting the true costs of maintaining each gravel road. This will be valuable information for the Board when it comes time to decide which road to pave.

We have the June Membership Meeting this Sunday; it is very important that we have good attendance so we can get needed business conducted. The Finance committee will be taking signups and needs to be approved at this meeting. Check-in will start at 2pm, the meeting will begin promptly at 3pm.

HPPOA Treasurer's Report June 21, 2023

Bank Balances as of the end of May 2023:

TOTAL Checking, Savings, Investments and Bond Reserve: \$7,772,292.65.

TOTAL Accounts Receivables: \$3,400,058.72

This account balance represents unpaid road maintenance fees, lien fees, finance charges, legal fees, collection expenses and bounced check charges as well as a few transfer fees that have been billed but not paid. The Accounts Receivable balance at 05/2022 was \$3,041,314.65. The annual billing for this year was \$3,447,576.00. As of June 14th we had a total of 6,534 owners paid in full or 73.8%. We took in \$1,100,000 in dues in February; \$1,342,000 in March, \$633,818 in April, and \$155,368 in May.

Allowance for Doubtful Accounts balance is: \$578,212.67 (This is a contra-asset account required by Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) that records the estimated dollar amount of receivables which may not be collectible.)

There were approximately 34 property transfers during the month of May.
