

Presidents Report

July 19, 2023

This past month the office sent out 1823 reminder statements to those owing over \$50 in past dues. With the increase in postage on July 9<sup>th</sup> to \$ .66 we felt it was important to get them out before the July 9<sup>th</sup> increase. The staff is working to prepare for the annual audit, prepare the files for the start of the next fiscal year and renewing liens on properties owing over \$1000.

We continued to work on the mailbox project, we have contracted with Hokori for the grading of the 4 sites. We have the go ahead from the county to start the grading and so the 6<sup>th</sup> & Makuu site will be the first to be done. We are having biweekly meetings now with the USPS. USPS will be providing 16 parcel lockers for each cluster, and we confirmed the ability to use a combination of concrete and asphalt for ADA requirements around the clusters to reduce costs. I asked them about the 2018 roadside plan that people seem to think was approved by them. They stated that they have NEVER approved a roadside plan for HPP, the only plan approved in 2018 was for boxes on the 2 sites at 14<sup>th</sup> & Kaloli and 16<sup>th</sup> & Makuu. They stated that after boxes were hit years back, they flew out to see the site in person and were amazed where the boxes were installed and how dangerous it is. Since then, they have been trying to get the boxes off the roadway for safety reasons.

Please continue to report issues that you see to the office so they can be addressed quickly and call the police for noise complaints, fireworks or speeding. This is a big place, and it takes many eyes to keep it running safely and smoothly.
