

This past month was a busy one with Auditors on site and the TRO hearing.

We had auditors on site over a week long period and addressed their requests and answered all their questions. They seemed very pleased when they left that things were in good order. They will prepare their final report for the BOD and make their recommendations in early December. Many thanks to Bonnie, Barbara and Shelli for all their hard work in finding the items requested so quickly.

We had the TRO hearing on September 29, 2023, and the judge ruled that the project construction may continue. Many thanks to Jeff Finley for his hours of time finding old documents and getting them to our attorney as he requested.

We continued to work on the mailbox park project, we have completed the 4th and Kaloli site, waiting on USPS now to install the boxes. The 6th and Makuu site is ready for asphalt around the concrete pads and will only require final rock on the driveways and road circling the mailbox clusters, signage and ADA markings. The 14th & Kaloli site is cleared and the green waste mulched. The 16th and Makuu site is currently being cleared. We continue to have biweekly meetings with the USPS. The goal is still to have mail service to the lower two sites in November.

The road crew continues to do an excellent job working on roads that had not been touched in years and working on the easements of the drives to add dry wells in those areas where rain water pools making our roads dangerous. Please be cautious on the roads when you see the crew at work.

We have learned many lessons from the Maui fires. It is extremely important to be prepared for all things possible. I am proud to say we have a well-trained CERT team (Citizen Emergency Response Team) and

Radio team to help in any emergency. Home owners can help by making sure that their address is clearly visible in the front of their property for essential services to find them. Keep grasses and dense vegetation cleared on your property and away from your home. We all can do our best to make our community as safe as possible.

Please continue to report road issues that you see to the office so they can be addressed quickly and call the police for noise complaints, fireworks or speeding. This is a big place, and it takes many eyes to keep it running safely and smoothly.
