ROADS:

Trash costs – 2.16 Tons of Rubbish hauled and disposed of at a cost of \$354.62

Easement Maintenance:

23rd and Kaloli has been completed. We are doing the minor ponding on the mains while the Hammer is being repaired. Next big flooding intersection will be the top of Makuu.

Roads Watered: 1.25 Miles watered. Another wet month so dust calls were almost non-existent

Equipment:

The new medium sized dump truck is in and we should be seeing it around the park shortly. The new engine on the old Back hoe is here. We are just awaiting for its installation. We have found a side arm mower located in Hawaiian Acres. The seller is off island for the time being, so we will be tying up the loose ends as soon as he gets back. We were able to look at multiple Water trucks, however, they were in need of repairs and did not fit our needs. We are going to schedule a trip to Oahu to look at a few to see if they fit our needs.

Misc:

We have all the necessary equipment needed to do a test run of Calcium Chloride on a stretch of gravel road, however, the weather is not cooperating with us. We have scheduled it for multiple days, but rains have caused us to postpone the test until the conditions improve. We have welcomed Robert Aku to the HPPOA family as part of our road crew, and he is doing well and has hit the ground running.
