The office has mailed out 2,300 reminder statements last week to all that still have balances due to HPP. We continue to send out pre-lien letters to those owing over \$800 to try to collect prior to placing a lien on the property.

The paving continues in HPP. Beach Road deadend Kaloli is complete, 6<sup>th</sup> and Makuu in front of the mailbox site and 14<sup>th</sup> and Kaloli in front of the mailbox site are also complete. Next to be paved is Ala Heiau from Beach road to the dead end at the cliffs.

We now have the permit for 16<sup>th</sup> and Makuu mail Park site to be completed with the grading and asphalt. This work is contracted with Hokori Construction who is also paving the roads so it will most likely have to wait till the paving is completed before they start back on this site. Installation of the mailboxes continues at 4<sup>th</sup> and Kaloli site, they are about halfway done now.

The election was completed with League of Women voters counting the ballots on June 5<sup>th</sup>. We have one open seat in district 6 for the up coming year that will be appointed by the Board at the July meeting. If you are interested in being on the Board, applications are due by July 12<sup>th</sup> to the HPP office. You do not have to live in district 6 to be appointed.

May was noted to be the wettest May on record. With all the rain we are seeing more potholes on our roads. Please continue to report road issues that you see to the office so they can be addressed quickly. All other issues, please call the police for noise complaints, fireworks or speeding.

HPP is a big place, and it takes many eyes to keep it running safely and smoothly.

Thanks for making HPP a place we can all be proud to call home!
