Trash: We have updated our permit for disposal of mixed rubbish at the County Dump

Animals – (4) dead pigs have been disposed of

We have begun spraying the requested frontages with Calcium Chloride with success. Majority of the roads that we have sprayed were prepped by grading, adding new aggregate, and compacting prior to the application. This is so that we don't have to re-apply, after we grade and drop new material on the road. The water truck has left the port on Oakland, and is making its way here. It is projected to reach Hilo on the 20th of September, with an anticipated release date of the 23rd of September. Parts for our Roller have arrived and Pape' has begun the maintenance and fixing. Now comes the troubleshooting with the on-board computer. We are looking forward to utilizing our own equipment instead of having to rent. The mailbox site on 14th and Kaloli has been completed as well as the paving adjacent to the site. Work has now begun on the paving of Ala Heiau. We are just about finished with the transition from First Hawaiian Bank to Bank of Hawaii, and the office is preparing all of the deliverables for this years annual audit. The staff is already projecting out for the future tasks like the Annual Invoices, BOD elections when it happens, and Mailbox key issue when the time comes. This way the daily tasks are not impacted when they come up. We have been able to accomplish a lot of tasks without the need for volunteers by anticipating and preparing.
