

Presidents Report

December 18, 2024

Happy Holidays as we finish out 2024. The office has been preparing for the annual mailing of the road maintenance bills and all the inserts required by the bylaws.

The annual audit is complete and the Board met with the auditors to review the findings. The final report has been approved by the Board at the December 4th meeting and is now posted on the HPPOA.net website.

The beautification of the Mail Park sites is progressing slowly. This project has so many owners excited about finally getting mail delivery close to home. This project has three phases, site development which is complete, Installation and service to the boxes which is being handled by USPS and the beautification of the sites to get them looking like a beautiful park that all can enjoy. While we have no control on phase 2, we do have control on the final step of beautification.

The 4th and Kaloli site has been sitting for over a year and has been overrun with weeds. We had around 12 volunteers come out in October for the first work party to kick off the beautification project but since then there has only been 3-4 of us continuing the work. Needless to say, the progress has been slow. We need the sites ready for use when USPS gives us the keys. The only way to accomplish this goal is to get more volunteers out to help us weed, plant the plants, spread cinder and trim trees. If we had more volunteers, it could be done in no time. We are out working at the site every Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 4pm till pau. In addition, the 2nd and 4th Saturdays of the month. The next work party will be December 28 at 7am to 11am.

The 6th and Makuu site is looking great. There has been some volunteers working daily at that site and it looks great. We will be bringing in cinder to this site soon and start planting the plants. The next work party at this site will be the first Sunday of January, on the 5th. The work party last Sunday had 10 volunteers and we made good progress. The key to phase 3 is getting more help by those that will be using the mailboxes. While there will be no charge to owners for a box, we ask that you help with phase 3 by volunteering to help beautify the sites.

With New Years around the corner, please remember the limited hours that fireworks are permitted in HPP. If there is an issue with fireworks, contact the police. Please continue to report road issues that you see to the office so they can be addressed quickly.
