The legal cases are as follows:

Case #1 Nicole Craig (HPP Owner) vs HPPOA, Hoffman & Finley continue to proceed. Trial date is set for January 25, 2025. This case is for Breach of Fiduciary Duty regarding mailbox parks being placed on the 20-acre sites, use of funds for mailbox sites, Application of 421-J and Hoffman & Finley misleading the Board. We have been having to provide documents and information requested by her which has taken the Board and office staff over 100 hours of time to gather.

Case #2 Nicole Craig vs HPPOA and all directors. This case was filed in the US District Court in violation of the Fair Housing Act, 42 for discriminating against her
